Recently Enacted Legislation Impacting Bankruptcy

1. H.R. 2336, the "<u>Family Farmer Relief Act of 2019</u>," which increases the debt limit used to determine whether a family farmer is eligible for relief under chapter 12 of the Bankruptcy Code from \$4,411,400 to \$10,000,000.

8/26/19 – Became Public Law 116-51- Effective upon enactment.

H.R. 2938, the "<u>Honoring American Veterans in Extreme Need Act of 2019</u>" (HAVEN Act) which excludes from the calculation of monthly income, for purposes of the Bankruptcy Code's means test, certain benefits paid by the Department of Veterans Affairs and the Department of Defense.

8/26/19 – Became Public Law 116-52 - Effective upon enactment.

3. H.R. 3304, the "<u>National Guard and Reservists Debt Relief Extension Act of 2019</u>," extends the temporary authorization exempting certain qualifying reserve component members of the Armed Services and National Guard members from the Bankruptcy Code's means test for four years.

8/26/19 – Became Public Law 116-52 - Effective upon enactment.

4. H.R. 3311, the "<u>Small Business Reorganization Act of 2019</u>," which establishes new subchapter V within chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code under which small business debtors can reorganize using more simplified and expedited procedures.

8/26/19 – Became Public Law 116-54 – Effective 180 days from enactment. [February 19, 2020]
