COURT ELECTRONIC NOTICING PROCEDURES  
General Procedures Order Number 00-002

THIS MATTER arises *sua sponte* upon the need for the Court to announce its procedures for obtaining notices electronically. Pursuant to Federal Rule of Bankruptcy Procedure 9036-Notice by Electronic Transmission and Local Bankruptcy Rule 9036-1, the court may direct notice by electronic transmission if the entity entitled to receive the bankruptcy notice requests in writing that the notice be transmitted electronically. This written request requirement is fulfilled through an electronic noticing agreement. In addition, pursuant to LBR 9036-1, the Clerk has certified to the court that the clerk possess sufficient staff and equipment, has adopted appropriate procedures and has completed adequate training to make the giving of notice by such means efficient and practical.


Accordingly, it is ORDERED that the Court will provide electronic noticing agreements through the judiciary's Bankruptcy Noticing Center to any entity requesting this service. The terms and procedures for electronic noticing are detailed in the court's noticing agreement provided by the Bankruptcy Noticing Center.
